<b>CQ Researcher</b> Explores issues in the news, including environmental topics
<b>General Science Collection</b> Full text of more than 60 science journals and magazines
<b>LexisNexis</b> Especially good for environmental law and newspaper resources
<b>Opposing Viewpoints</b> Access information on environmental issues from different points of view
<b>Science Direct</b> Click on SEARCH then Select "Environmental Science" from Subject menu
