

Constitution of the Science Club  
Schenectady County Community College

**Article I**      The name of this organization shall be the Science Club.

**Article II**      The purpose of this organization is to:

- (1)      Promote the study of all sciences including but not limited to the fields of chemistry, biology, physics, and astronomy.
- (2)      Provide contact with various institutions concerned with science such as other universities, museums, aquariums, planetariums, etc.
- (3)      Encourage the meeting of students with potential employers and higher institutions of education within their particular field of study.

**Article III**      Any student who has paid the student activity fee and has an interest in science may participate in the activities of this organization. A voting member of this organization is one who has paid the membership fee that will be determined yearly at the beginning of the fall semester.

**Article IV**      Officers and their respective duties shall be as follows:

(1)      President:      The president shall call all meetings, preside over all meetings, and assist the secretary with activities and publicity.

(1)      Vice President:      The vice president shall fulfill all duties of the president in his/her absence, preside over all meetings, and aid the president with activities and publicity.

(2)      Secretary:      The secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings, handle all correspondence of the organization with the assistance of the president, and aid the president with activities and publicity.

(3)      Treasurer:      The treasurer shall be responsible for all monies of the organization, submit all budget requests, and deposit all monies into organization accounts.

**Article V**      An amendment to this constitution may be made at any time, provided that it is ratified by a two-thirds majority of the voting membership of the organization.

**Article VI**      This organization is subject to the rules of Schenectady County Community College and its Student Government Association.

**Amendment I** Retroactively effective to January 2006:

A member in good standing:

- pays member dues
- honors commitments to the club including but not limited to:
  - meeting attendance
  - participation in fund raising
  - volunteer opportunities
  - community involvement

A member may be excused from commitments with a reason that is valid and documental

Only members in good standing will be considered for activities that benefit club members and for which club funding is utilized.
