HARTWICK COLLEGE

Transfer Agreement in Music Education between Hartwick College and Schenectady Coundy Community College

This document describes an agreement between Hartwick College, Oneonta, New York, and Schenectady County Community College, Schenectady, New York, to facilitate transfer for students from Schenectady County Community College who wish to earn baccalaureate degrees in Music Education at Hartwick College.

- 1. Students who have successfully completed an Associate of Science in Performing Arts-Music degree at Schenectady Community College with a cumulative average of 2.75 or higher, meet the usual criteria for admission to Hartwick College and the department of Music, and pass the music audition are guaranteed admission with first-term junior standing (60 credits) to the Department of Music at Hartwick College. To earn a Hartwick Baccalaureate degree (120 credits), they must:
 - a. Complete at least 60 credits at Hartwick with a cumulative average of 2.00 or higher.
 - b. Take the writing placement examination. Depending on the result, additional course work in writing may be necessary to attain the level required for graduation.
 - c. Complete Hartwick College's general education requirements in Quantitative and Formal Reasoning, Foreign Language and Breadth and Integration. [Please note that SCCC students who fulfill the conditions of this agreement and have completed all ten of the SUNY general education requirements will have fulfilled all these requirements except one course, in either the Social Sciences or the Humanities, which fulfills the experiential/integrative learning seminar requirement.]
 - d. Satisfy the Physical Education requirement by taking two one-credit skills courses, at Hartwick or elsewhere.
 - e. Complete the requirements for the Music Education degree with a cumulative average of 3.0 or higher.
 - f. Education majors who transfer courses completed with less than a C will have to retake those courses to be recommended for certification.
- 2. Students from Schenectady County Community College who transfer to Hartwick without the A.S. degree must meet the usual conditions for admission to Hartwick College. Courses with grades of 'C' or higher will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis.
- 3. Hartwick College agrees to inform Schenectady County Community College of any future changes in these requirements and to provide a reasonable schedule for implementation of such changes.
- 4. Both Hartwick College and Schenectady County Community College agree to encourage qualified students to participate in this arrangement and to provide students with appropriate information, advising and assistance
- 5. Representatives from both institutions will confer from time to time and at least biannually to monitor the use of this agreement and consider any changes that affect the agreement and possible improvements to the agreement.
- 6. This agreement, which supersedes the agreement dated January 13, 2006, may be revised or cancelled by mutual agreement between the two institutions. It may be revised or cancelled by either party at the end of any academic year, provided that written notice is submitted to the other party at least twelve months before the effective date.
